The number of clubs sponsoring new clubs, exceeded all expectations.

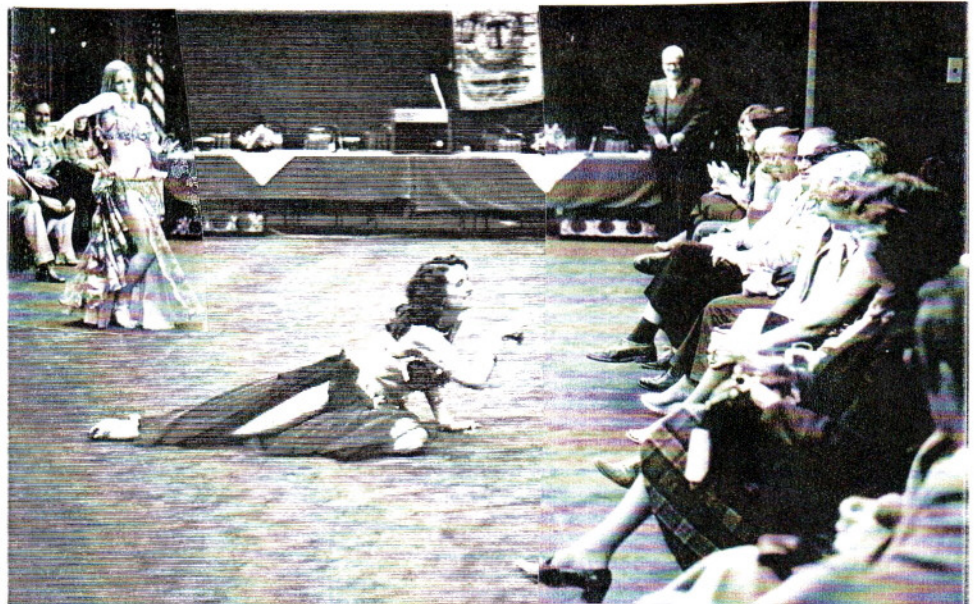
Ours was the most successful year all around in the history of the District. Although we didn't make PDD, we came very close. We finished number 14 with 72 points.

Could I share a humorous incident? It was a humorless year!



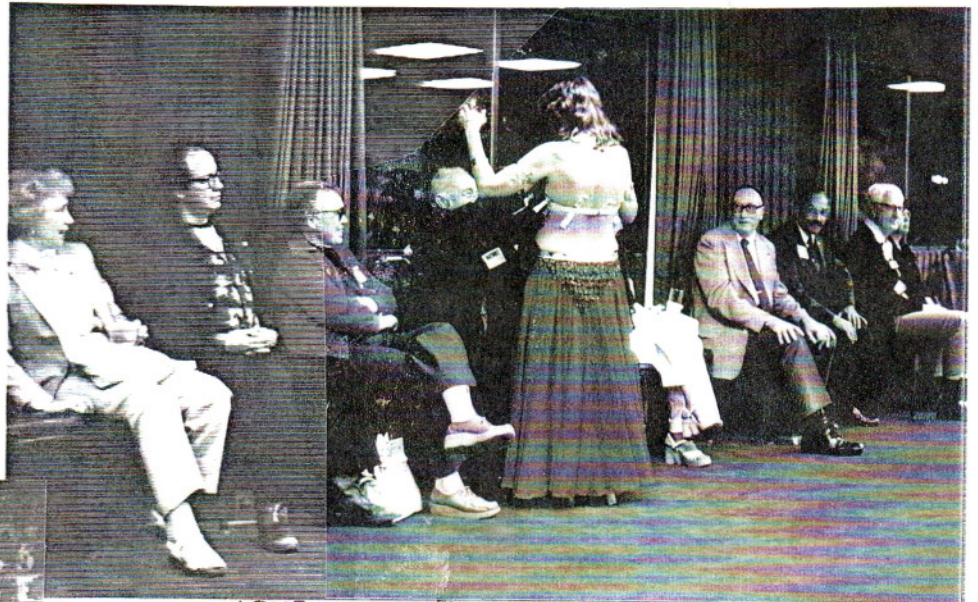
